Unfortunately, punctuality remains an issue, in fact on just one morning a few weeks ago, there were 43 pupils who came in late equating to 838 minutes, that's nearly 14 hours of lost learning - we can't say this enough, give your children the opportunity to be the best they can be and get them into school regularly and on time!!

Yes - but please let us know:

Hand, foot and mouth Glandular fever

Head lice Cold / sniffles Tonsillitis

Threadworm (after treatment) Slapped cheek

#### No - so when can I send them back in?



Chickenpox - for 5 days or until the blisters have crusted over

Diarrhoea & vomiting - they can return 48 hours after their last episode

Flu - once their temp has come down and they feel well enough to attend

I mpetigo - once their sores have crusted over or 48 hours after they started antibiotics

Scarlet Fever - 24 hours after starting antibiotics

Whooping cough - 48 hours after starting antibiotics

Scables - once they've had their first treatment

Measles - 4 days after the rash appeared

**Mumps** - 5 days after the swelling started

### Did you know?

Did you know that if your child is any later than 9.25am, instead of being marked as an L (Late before registers close), they are marked as а и (Late after registers closed) which means their whole morning mark is lost. A pupil can have low attendance without even having had a days absence!

# Attendance focus

On 19th August 2024, the Department for Education (DfE) are changing the statutory guidance that schools adhere to, in order maintain high levels of school attendance. One of the things we thought was most important to let parents know about are the changes in the Penalty Notices which will come into force on that date - here's a brief summary.

Penalty notices - these are issued by the Local Authority for either continuous punctuality or attendance concerns within a 10 week sliding period or for holidays which are longer than 5 days (or 10 sessions).

The guidance states that within a 3 year rolling period:

- The first penalty notice issued to a parent in respect of a particular pupil will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days. - currently £60
- Within that 3 year period, if a second penalty notice is issued to the same parent in respect of the same pupil, the penalty notice is charged at a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days (currently £60).
- If there is a further concern regarding attendance/punctuality of the same pupil within those 3 years, or a holiday is taken (longer than 5 days), the Local Authority will take alternative action instead, which could include considering prosecution, but may include other tools such as one of the other attendance legal interventions (currently £60).
